

Deferred Graduate Tuition Payment Plan

Full-time students enrolled in a graduate program at the University of Niagara Falls Canada can opt-in to the Deferred Graduate Tuition Payment Plan.

This optional fee deferment is an agreement with University of Niagara Falls Canada that allows students to defer paying a portion of their tuition fees to later terms during their program of study. Participation is subject to the below Terms and Conditions.

Terms and Conditions

Eligibility

To be considered for the Deferred Graduate Tuition Payment Plan, a student must:

- Be registered in a full-time graduate degree program. Students enrolled in part-time studies, undergraduate or preparatory programs are not eligible to participate.
- Remain in good academic standing.
- Be in full compliance with the institution's requirements to have a copy of the full study permit on file, local address and phone number on account, and emergency contact information up to date and validated.
- Have received their final letter of acceptance and already paid their required deposit specified in their conditional letter of acceptance.

This plan is available to students beginning their graduate program in the January 2025 intake onwards.

Deferral Process

Submissions

- Students may request inclusion in the optional plan only after paying their required deposit specified in their conditional letter of acceptance and receiving a final letter of acceptance.
- Students must use the online submission form to request inclusion in the program and agree to these Terms and Conditions.
- Requests for tuition payment deferral consideration must be submitted to the institution no later than end of the student's first academic term of their graduate program.

Deferrals

- Students may defer payment for 10% of their total tuition from Terms 1, 2, and 3 to Terms 4 and 5.
- Only tuition fees can be deferred.
- Additional fees and other charges to the student account may not be deferred.
- Deposit or tuition payments made prior to opting into the plan will not be refunded and will be applied to the student account balance.

- The deferred balance owing at the end of Term 3 will be applied to the student account and payable in two instalments split equally to Terms 4 and 5.

Late Payment

- Should a student fail to make their required deferred tuition payment within 10 days from the start date of the term, a late fee of \$200 will be charged to the account. In addition, the full outstanding balance of their fees account becomes due immediately.

Outstanding Fees

- As per the Graduation and Promotion policy, all outstanding fees to the university, including the deferred tuition fees, must be fully paid to be eligible to graduate.

Withdrawals

- In the event of a full withdrawal from the program of study, the full balance of the student's deferred tuition will become due.

Modification and Termination

- UNF reserves the right to modify or terminate the deferral program at any time without prior notice. Any changes will be communicated through the university's official channels.
- Existing deferrals will be honoured as per the terms at the time of submission, even if the program is modified or terminated.
